Employee will independently and collaboratively use education, experience, technical expertise, and effective oral and writing skills to provide regulatory and operational guidance, troubleshoot operational problems in the field, assist regulated entities and consultants, and provide timely responses to inquiries, questions, and concerns from the public. Successful candidate will develop and provide hands-on training sessions at mandated operator certification courses and other specialized education workshops. Employee will manage all aspects of the Recycling and Illegal Dumping grant program.

Position requires Bachelor's Degree in physical/life/environmental sciences, soil science, engineering, and a minimum of two (2) years of work experience in public/environmental science or health, Air Quality Management, Biology, Engineering Chemistry, Geology Hazardous Waste Management, Wildlife Management and/or Water Resources, or a combination of relevant experience.

Work experience in solid waste, recycling, natural resource management, communications, public administration, grant administration, teaching science at the high school level, and development of course materials, use of teaching, training and public outreach techniques; or a combination of above is preferred.
